Use < (less than), > (greater than), = (equal to) symbols to write 5 comparison sentences: e.g.: the tin of beans > the potato. • Converting Units: You will need to remember the place value work we had begun on multiplying and dividing by 10, 100, 1000. Learn these facts. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 1g = 0.001 kg • 10g = 0.01 kg • 100g = 0.1 kg • 1000g = 1 kg • Convert the weight of the 10 items you weighed earlier into kilograms. e.g.: Potato = 312g = 0.321kg. • Do some baking. Make sure you are in charge of weighing the ingredients and reading the scale (if your scales are not electric!). Writing Tasks

- Purple Mash 2Do – AMW, BC, RB, DB – Linked to Chapter 3 of Buster's Blitz. Someone Special – describe someone who is very special to you.
- Purple Mash 2Do – AAA, AHD, ShH, SiH, FK, LF – Linked to Chapter 3 of Alien Hotel. Write a guidebook about the Hotel Kazoom and complete Pugg Cam- show Pugg's thoughts and feelings in a speech bubble – you can record your voice if you wish!.
- Write a list poem about all the things you like. Which adjectives and adverbs could you include too?
e.g.: I like eating juicy, sweet strawberries. Don't forget to use commas correctly in a list! You could try to include some alliteration or onomatopoeia too
- If you were to become a superhero what would your superpower be? Write a character description of yourself as a superhero. Explain how you would save the day. You could use 2Publish on Purple Mash if you wanted – or just paper and pens!
- Retell a traditional tale from another character's point of view. Watch one of these videos

Learning Project - to be done throughout the week - VIEWPOINTS

The project this week aims to provide opportunities for your child to learn more about different viewpoints. Learning may focus on physical viewpoints in terms of what you can see outside of the window at home, what others can see looking into your home and then progress onto personal viewpoints and of others.

- **Let's Wonder:**

Draw a picture of yourself and label your drawing with the qualities you have. How do others see you differently? Ask people at home to add the qualities they see. How are you different to other children in different parts of the world? What makes you similar to other children around the world?



- **Let's Create:**

Andy Goldsworthy is a British artist and sculptor who only uses natural materials to create amazing art in the place where he finds the material. - **Be Active:**

Move around your home and garden taking photographs from different viewpoints. Which photos do you like? Do the people you live with like the same photos as you? Why? Why not? Take photos of your Andy Goldsworthy style art from different angles/viewpoints – how does it change the art? Which viewpoint is your favourite and why?

Recommendation at least 2 hours of exercise a week.



- **Time to Talk:**

Talk about keeping safe with someone at home, discuss different ways to keep safe. Basic hygiene rules – especially handwashing, road safety, internet safety, water safety, being safe around the home, stranger danger. How do different people view this?



- **Understanding Others and Appreciating Differences:**

Listen to different pieces of music from around the world, which styles of music do you prefer and why? [Music](#) Maybe you could learn a song by heart and perform it.



- **Reflect:**

Design your own ideal world. Would your world contain the same things as other people? Which things are most important to you? What are you going to include?
