
Maths Tasks

This week we are learning about: 3D Shape

Vocbaulary: straight, curved, surfaces, face, edge, vertex (1 point/corner), vertices (more than 1 vertex).

- Purple Mash 2Do Spelling words to practice and learn from the common exception word lists that we practice in school.
- Purple Mash 2Do Bella and the Farm Prepositions (show when or where something
 happened) e.g. <u>During</u> the storm my
 umbrealla broke. My house is <u>next to</u> the
 park.
- Purple Mash 2Do Compound Nouns 2 words that are put together to make one e.g. bedroom, playground, postman...
- Purple Mash 2Do Word hop. Use was/were, did/done, has/had correctly in sentences.

Writing Tasks

- Purple Mash 2Do AMW, BC, RB, DB Linked to Chapter 6 of Buster's Blitz. Compare the charaters of Mr Leeming and Joe. Do they have anything in common?
- Purple Mash 2Do AAA, AHD, ShH, SiH, FK, LF – Linked to Chapter 6 of Alien Hotel.
 Complete the character comparison activity. Also, What would Sally Miton be thinking/feeling while she is dancing?
- BAKE OFF! Add to the Llamas Lockdown Blog on Purple Mash – click on the 'Sharing' icon and go into the 'Shared Blogs' tab and it's in there. This week there is a cooking challenge!
- Write a postcard to a family member recounting a celebration that has just taken place e.g.: Eid, Easter, a birthday, and anniversary...
- Write a set of instructions for 'How to play the new game?' (see the 'Let's Create' section on the next page). Remember to include a list of things they will need. Also not forgetting to include headings and subheadings. Then write your set of instructions, remembering to include imperative verbs. (Bossy verbs that command you to do something – move, put, roll...). Think about the key rules!
- Write a non-chronological report about a particular religious festival you have found out about (see the 'Let's Wonder' section on the next page).
- Write a scary story that would be great to read aloud on Halloween. Use the images on <u>Spooky</u> to give you some inspiration.
- Design a card celebrating a religious celebration, remember to include a poem/verse for inside. You could make either an Eid, Easter, Diwali card etc....

Learning Project - to be done throughout the week - Celebrations

This project this week aims to provide opportunities for your child to learn more about celebrations. Learning may focus and different types of celebrations that take place and who may celebrate them. It could look at how people celebrate different events differently in other parts of the world.

Let's Wonder:

How are birthdays celebrated around the world? <u>India China America Africa</u> etc.. maybe there's a particular country you would like to find out about. Create fact files to show the similarities and differences between them.



Let's Create:

Create a board game that focuses on celebrations. Think about what you can learn from it? Think about how to play the game. Is it going to be a game like Monopoly or Snakes and Ladders? Are you going to need a dice/spinner? Cards? Characters? etc....



Be Active:

Why not play a game of hopscotch? Can't find any chalk? Use a stone from the garden. Raining? Build an indoor den and have an imaginary celebration with your toys. **Recommendation at least 2 hours of exercise a week.**



• Time to Talk:

Look through photos of previous celebrations that you and your family have taken part in. What can you remember happened? Why do they and their families celebrate the way they do?



Understanding Others and Appreciating differences:

How many different types of celebrations are there? Who celebrates Christmas? St Patrick's Day? St George's Day? St David's Day? Easter? Eid? Diwali? Chinese New Year? How do they celebrate – special food, gifts, family, worship? Which celebrations have you taken part in? What usually happens?
